Identification of patient shall be done before all care process. In particular, correct identification shall be established before initiating any of the given procedures:

One of the most common causes of medical errors are improper identification of patient. Following protocol is recommended to accurately identify a patient:

Patient Identifying Details:

At the registration Desk, Patient Identification details shall include:

- 1. Patient Full Name
- 2. Date of Birth
- 3. Patient Guardians' Name (Mother/Father/Spouse)

UHID should be generated at the end of registration process.

The **Name of Patient** and **UHID** shall be used as a **standard identifier** for identifying any patient in the hospital

Use of Patient Identification Band (ID band)

- 1. ID Band should be placed on each every patient admitted in the hospital, in case of injury or patient is a neonate the band can be placed on ankle.
- 2. Patients Full Name and UHID along with one or more than one identifier (DOB etc.) to be printed in indelible ink and clear writing.
- 3. Patient shall not be able to self-remove the ID band, once placed. ID band shall be removed by cutting at the time of discharge, or if a correction is required in the band.
- 4. Incase patient refuses to use the ID band the same shall be documented in the patient file.

Process of Identifying

- 1. Staff shall ask the name of the patient and his/her date of birth and match the response with the name printed on his/her ID band.
- 2. Staff shall then check the UHID on ID band and match it with the UHID on patient's record.
